Snowflakes

- Teams differ in skills, experience capabilities
- Projects differ in budgets, schedules, scope, risk, etc.
- Organizations differ in value chains, target markets, business drivers, culture
- *Give yourselves permission to be flexible and experiment*



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Knowledge Management at IU

- Custom solution, 25 years in the making
- 3 software developers, 1 QA, 1 BA
 - Adopted scrum 3 years ago
- 6 technical editors
 - Adopted Kanban 2 years ago
- Dynamic web content served to a KB and REST end points
- Strong culture of support



Kanban – what and why?

- ‘kanban’ = signal card
 - Toyota Production System
 - *‘kaizen’* = continuous improvement
- Identify constraints (reveal capacity)
- Pull system
- Goal: sustainable pace of work and adaptable process change (incremental)



Kanban – what and why?

- Focus on *value* (some say quality)
- Reduce work in progress (wip)
- Deliver often
- Balance demand against throughput
- Prioritize
- Reduce variability to improve predictability



Agile is a mindset

- Stop starting and start finishing!
- Treat people like adults
- Run the experiment (make it *safe to fail!*)
- Continuous improvement - not just on the product, but the process too – *kaizen*
- Feedback loops
- Pairing and swarming
- Focus on value



Benefits are emergent

- Reduced WIP improves quality
- Improved quality improves trust
- Demand can be balanced against capacity with pull system
- Exposed bottlenecks, once addressed will create slack; reducing variability requires slack
- Slack enables improvement opportunities
